CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT

- **Waves of Change: Creating Campus Responses to Sexualized Violence**

May 2017 – Present

I developed and authored a 5 module sexual violence prevention program drawing on extensive research into bystander intervention training as a form of sexual violence prevention, a review of best practice programming in North America, and rooted in theories of feminist pedagogy for social change. This peer-to-peer training program also includes a Facilitator's Training Module for students to develop their skills as peer-facilitators. The curriculum has been through a successful preliminary evaluation process and has been recommended by the provincial Sexual Violence Prevention Committee under the Department of Labour and Advanced Education as best practice in their Changing the Culture of Acceptance report (2018). As of 2020, every university in Nova Scotia as well as the NSCC has implemented the Waves of Change training on their campuses.

In completing my doctoral research, I engaged a variety of qualitative research methods. My dissertation examined collective memory of coal mining in the climate of deindustrialized Nova Scotia. My primary research material was derived from ethnographic field work in Nova Scotia over the summer months of 2015 and 2016, as well as archival research in the Nova Scotia Archives. I drew on participant-observation methodologies in touring each of the provinces mining museums and monuments, as well as semi-structured interviews with several cultural producers including activists, tour-guides, interpreters and retired coal miners.

My role in this SSHRC funded study was to engage in the Toronto priority neighbourhood of Weston - Mount Denis as a participant observer of anti-poverty organizing led by the ACORN Toronto organization. I was also responsible for conducting semi-structured interviews with these participants. Some of the interviews that I conducted also involved visual anthropology and participant-led walking tours of the neighbourhood. I co-presented some of the findings of this study at the 2012 Historical Materialism conference at York University.
